COMMUNITY OUTREACH IDEAS/EVENTS



Cheriton: the women's Bible study group baked cookies and other goodies for shut-ins and others in their community and then delivered baked goods for Valentine's Day.

Lower Northampton, Cape Charles, and other churches and individuals partner together with the **Adopt-a-Block** food distribution that provides food to

under-resourced individuals living in apartment communities.
Seniors receive a 35-pound FDA box of food and some families

receive a TANF box of food.

Volunteers go door-to-door asking residents if they could use the food

and offering to pray for them and their family members. For those who do not qualify for the boxed food programs, they provide bags of food.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH IDEAS/EVENTS

Thalia Lynn in partnership with the PIN (People in Need) ministry collected over 100 bags of food. The items were easy-to-prepare food items and snacks for homeless individuals and families who are in temporary housing due to the



winter weather. In addition to this special collection, they distribute food each week through their food panty to individuals and families in need of food items.



Calvary Heart to Table Ministry provides frozen meals to those in need based on Matt. 25:35-40. They prepare meals in advance, freeze them, and distribute as needs arise. Perhaps there is someone who lost a loved one, had surgery, dealing with mental health issue, or

is just spread too thin due to the burdens of life. The list goes on and on to the reasons why someone is struggling, it is not our place to judge but to help.

Lower Northampton hosts Community Meals that have served 150-200 people each time. They have served soup, BBQ sandwiches, etc. People have come to the church to pick up meals, and they have taken meals to the Food Lion employees.





Kings Grant is providing a 12day family devotion using Easter Eggs. These can be picked up at church in person or through a no contact process for families that are still virtual. If a small church

likes this idea, and needs resources, please don't hesitate to reach out to Amy at the church.

Coastal is providing Family Easter Boxes. The boxes include Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math activities, crafts, snacks, coloring sheets, a family devotion, resurrection eggs and an Easter Escape room. These boxes are



designed for families to have time to connect and grow closer to each other as well as growing closer to Jesus!

We build our inventory thru donations, so what we have varies from month to month. We have clothes from preemie-2T.



We have five films from Patterns of Evidence.




Exodus: This film unlocks the mystery of this ancient saga, combining a scientific investigation with a retelling of the Exodus story to reveal an amazing pattern of evidence matching the biblical account that may challenge our understanding of history.

The Red Sea Miracle, Part 1 & 2: One of the greatest accounts in the Bible tells of Moses and the Israelites leaving Egypt, crossing a desert, and then being trapped at the sea by Pharaoh. God miraculously saves



the Israelites and destroys the Egyptian army. Did this event take place as recorded in the Bible, and if so, where did it happen?



The Moses Controversy: Did Moses write the first books of the Bible? The Bible states, Yes! This film's investigation leads to the groundbreaking discovery that the world's first alphabet actually originated in Egypt. This thought-provoking film asks hard questions of some of the world's leading experts in Egyptology, ancient Hebrew and early languages.

Searching for the Red Sea Crossing:

This is a six session, in depth conversation with Dr. Glen Fritz and Tim Mahoney. For centuries there has been mystery and debate surrounding the sea miraculously crossed by the Israelites on their Exodus. Glen Fritz believes this issue will not be solved primarily with linguistics or archaeolo-



gy, but rather it requires a geographic approach. He gives an in-depth biblical and geographic case for the Gulf of Aqaba being the YamSuph of the Exodus, and how its position provides vital clues to the location of Mt. Sinai.


